## Campaign Questions

**Priorities: What would be your top three priorities?**

**Answer** Transition away from fossil fuels and nuclear energy to clean alternative sources / Full support and funding of public schools and union teachers / Raising the minimum wage to \$15/hr or more

**Campaign Finance: What further changes, if any, to campaign finance regulation and enforcement in New York State do you propose? Please explain your answer.**

**Answer** We need to scrap the entire campaign finance system as it currently exists and replace it with a Clean Money / Clean Elections, publicly funded campaign finance system model. I support the Clean Money Elections bills A4116 / S4501 which would institute a publicly funded system similar to those of Arizona and Maine.

**Election Reform: What election reforms would you support, such as: early voting; voting by mail; better ballot design; and voter registration modernization?**

**Answer** The reforms mentioned above are important but only superficial fixes. We need to: Eliminate fusion (running candidates on more than one ballot line) / Initiate same day voter registration / Make it easier for independent political parties to gain ballot status / Make it easier for candidates to get on the ballot / Introduce proportional representation / Sign into law the National Popular Vote initiative which would nullify the Electoral College / Require "None of the Above" on all ballots

**Economy: What steps would you propose at the state level regarding income inequality, while maintaining an environment that encourages economic growth?**

**Answer** Bring back the type of progressive tax system we had up until the 1970s, which taxed the wealthy at much higher rates than we have at present. End the practice of rebating the stock transfer tax back to Wall Street firms. This would place \$15 billion + per year into the state treasury. I would turn around and restate the second part of the above question as a phrase to read "We need to control & regulate economic growth in order to encourage a sustainable environment."

**Redistricting: Do you support the redistricting proposal appearing on the ballot this November? Please explain your answer.**

**Answer** I do not support the redistricting proposal. It doesn't create a truly independent commission. It just shifts the responsibility a degree from direct decisions by legislators to their chosen proxies. Since the commission would be composed of an even number of members, deadlocks could easily occur, shifting the tie breaking vote back to the legislators anyway.
